Fr. Louis J. Wilimek

Born in Cudahy, Dec. 5, 1925, to John and Frances Wilimek, Fr. Louis J. Wilimek had four siblings, Fr. B.J. Wilimek, John Wilimek, Mary Boltik and Frances Wilimek. He attended St. Joseph Grade School, Cudahy, and Pio Nono High School, Milwaukee. He received his priestly formation at Saint Francis Seminary, and continued his education at Marquette University and the University of Notre Dame. He was ordained Feb. 19, 1950, at Saint Francis Seminary by Archbishop Moses E. Kiley.

Fr. Wilimek began his priestly ministry as administrator at St. George Syrian Eastern Uniate Church, Milwaukee, 1950, and St. Joseph, Cudahy, 1950-1959. He continued his ministry by teaching at St. Mary's Academy, Milwaukee. He served at St. Francis de Sales Parish, Lake Geneva, 1971-2001, where he was also administrator of St. Francis de Sales School. He was a member of the Walworth County Marriage Counseling Service, and the executive board Lake Geneva Citizens Committee and Youth Council. He served as pastor at St. John Evangelist, Kohler, from 1971-2001.

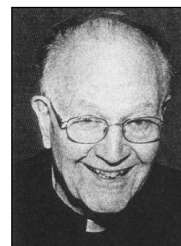

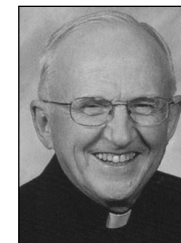

Darby. He attended St. Michael Grade School, Milwaukee, and St. Edward Grade School, Racine. He received his priestly formation at Saint Francis Minor Seminary, Milwaukee, Theological College in Washington, D.C., and North American College in Rome. He received a master's degree in philosophy from The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., and a licentiate in theology from the Gregorian University in Rome. He was ordained to the priesthood on Dec. 20, 1959 in the chapel of the North American College.

Fr. Whalen began his priestly ministry in 1963 as an associate pastor at Mary Queen of Heaven, West Allis, and as an associate instructor in theology at Alverno College, Milwaukee. In 1963 he was assigned to teach high school Latin at De Sales Preparatory Seminary. He continued serving at the archdiocesan seminary, teaching courses in philosophy, theology and scripture at Saint Francis de Sales College and Saint Francis Seminary, 1966-1978, during which time he pursued graduate studies at Marquette University and the University of San Francisco.

During his final five years on the seminary faculty, Fr. Whalen also ministered as pastoral associate at St. Hyacinth, Milwaukee, where in 1978 he was asked to become pastor; he served there until 1986. He was then appointed pastor of St. Bernadette, Milwaukee, where he served until his retirement in 2001. Currently, Fr. Whalen is a member of St. Catherine of Siena, Ripon, where he assists regularly as a senior priest and where he celebrated his jubilee on Dec. 20, 2009.

"It has been so helpful for me to reflect on the unique vocational value of these senior years," Fr. Whalen said. He called to mind an insight of the
